















Some Interesting facts

- 1. The sentence, "The quick brown fox jumps over the lazy dog" uses every letter in the English language
- 2. "I Am" is the shortest complete sentence in the English language
- 3. There are only two words in the English language that have all five vowels in order: "abstemious" and "facetious."
- 4. The name of all the continents end with the same letter that they start with.
- 5. The "sixth sick sheik's sixth sheep's sick" is said to be the toughest tongue twister in the English language.
- 6. Rhythm" is the longest English word without a vowel.
- 7. Each king in a pack of playing cards represents great king from history. Spades - King David Clubs - Alexander the Great, Hearts - Charlemagne Diamonds - Julius Caesar.
- 8. Stewardesses is the longest word typed with only the left hand.
- 9. The most common letter in English is "e".
- 10. The most common vowel in English is "e", followed by "a".
- 11. The most common consonant in English is "r", followed by "t"
- 12. Every syllable in English must have a vowel (sound). Not all syllables have consonants.
- 13. Only two English words in current use end in "-gry". They are "angry" and "hungry".
